Regulations for *Kid Scoop News* **Reporters**



Only a small number of student writers will be selected to join the prestigious team of *Kid Scoop* reporters. Our expectations are high and we want all involved to have a good understanding of these. This newspaper is a countywide monthly publication (*Kid Scoop News*) and a nationally weekly publication (*Kid Scoop*). The combined circulation is 7 million readers.

Those selected will be strong writers. They will be taught to become better writers and good reporters. This will take place at monthly training meetings and through valuable experience. Each young writer will strive to work on one to two stories per school year. Everyone will be asked to provide a professional photo of themselves. This will be used for the paper and Press Passes.

Self motivation is essential. Young writers will present ideas for stories and their plan of action. Each writer will be asked for a list of five big stories they would like to cover. Previous reporters attended a Town Hall meeting at the White House, interviewed a NASCAR legend, and covered a football game at the Superdome and then met the Super Bowl coach. These five stories are their goals for the year. They will work to achieve them all, but will find certain opportunities more available than others. Where opportunities are presented, they will follow leads and move forward – professionally, and politely.

Students need to be creative and diligent when working to achieve interviews and appointments. Some of this information will be gained in the monthly training meetings, but a portion will be determined by the tenacity of the student reporter (and their supportive parent). These children must be strong and determined. The young reporters will do research, create questions, and conduct interviews. Parents and teachers may assist when needed; however, the goal is for the student to do this as independently as possible.

Parental involvement is a MUST for each child to be a successful young reporter. Parents need to be available to drive and often attend the monthly writers' meetings. They must serve as a guide for their child when making contacts for interviews, assisting them in making phone calls, writing letters, and sending emails. Parents need to provide transportation for their child to cover a story or conduct an interview. The young reporters must be accompanied at all times at a story/interview location. It will be the job of the parent to serve as their child's assistant during this time (ie: taking photos, gathering memorabilia, locating restrooms, etc). This is a time for parents to serve, while their child is in the spotlight.

Parents will make sure their child fulfills his/her writing responsibilities and meets the required obligations for the deadline. This may require checking in with the child throughout the writing process. Parents will proof read the articles for spelling, punctuation, and overall grammatical errors. If needed, they will assist their child in emailing the final typed article, attaching photos, and meeting the paper's deadline.

This is a great opportunity for kids, but with this opportunity comes great responsibility!
